Alice Anne Stanley of Scott Depot, WV, departed from this earth on June 27th, 2024 at 2:00pm at the age of 65 years old, after bravely battling Primary Sclerosing Cholangitis and post-operative complications following her liver transplant. On this day, she saw the face of God, and her weary body found peace as she entered the arms of Jesus, welcomed by rejoicing angels.

Waiting in line to reunite with her once more, she was preceded in death by her mother, Elizabeth (Libby) Vickers whom her daughters never had the pleasure of meeting but were told about her often. Her father, Arthur (Art) Vickers whom she dearly loved and respected. Her brother, George Vickers whom shared the love for the Lord. Her beloved stepmother, Isabelle Vickers whom shared equal love for fine china and exuded pure class. I imagine the five of them reunited with smiles, embracing each other and catching up on the years that had passed.

She is survived by her husband of 22 years, Darwin Stanley, whom she loved unconditionally and with whom she shared countless laughs. She was his road trip buddy, car song duet partner, and best friend, with whom he shared a beautiful life.

She is also survived by her oldest daughter, Annie Cunningham whom strived to be half the Physician Assistant she was and respected her advice and will

never forget it. Her son-in-law, Eddie Cunningham who was there at the very end and stood by her during that fateful first 24 hours like a guardian angel. Her youngest daughter, Melody Dawn (fiancé Lee Stevens) who inherited her beauty and obviously learned how to be a great mom from her and will profoundly miss her and be forever grateful.

While deeply saddened by their mother's passing, they both stand united in praising God for the gift of having her as their mother and will never forget her loving embrace. She was truly the best.

She is also survived by her stepson, Dustin Stanley, and her daughter-in-law, Dr. Raquel Silhy Stanley, as well as her stepdaughter, Sarah Stanley.

Her grandchildren Charlie Cunningham , the apple of her eye and her movie theatre best friend; Lorelei Stevens, who reminded her what it was like to raise strong-willed girls; and Lynden Stevens, her red-headed angel who loved everything she made for him. Additionally, her step-grandchildren, Autumn, Maia, Jessica, Colin, and Dylan Stanley and Ivy Stevens, all of whom brought her immense joy and pride. She always thought of them as her own and proudly told everyone she had nine grandchildren.

Her youngest sister, Susie Lynne Shaffer, whom she loved deeply and with whom she first learned to sing duets with before she took her act onto future car rides with her family. Parsley, Sage, Rosemary and Thyme was a known classic to sing randomly throughout their lives. And although Susie hit mom over the head with a metal cash register at age 9, mom continued to love her sister but had no problem reminding everyone of this event.

Her beloved cousins and sister in laws whom she loved like her own sisters.

Her best friends, Kelli Myers, Joann Dyson, and Windi D'itri whom she valued

each friendship with so much and loved wholeheartedly.

Alice was born in Cumberland, Maryland and raised in Levittown, Pennsylvania where she graduated Neshaminy High School in 1976 top of her class. She often shared with her family her love for her hometown church First Baptist of Levittown where she just recently attended their 70th anniversary. Her fond memories of home included swimming in summers with her sister and neighbors and working at the local dairy shack just so she could eat her most favorite dessert, ice cream.

To no one's surprise, she embarked on a path few other women in her time pursued, becoming a Physician Assistant. She graduated from Alderson Broaddus College in 1980 and began her career at Thomas Hospital in fall 1980, where she cultivated a deeply rooted work family over nearly 45 years. Alice loved working as a surgical PA and enjoyed mentoring and training students to become the best versions of themselves. She was passionate about her work and dedicated to leaving behind a better future for PAs who followed in her footsteps.

When she wasn't being supermom, wife, and grandmother, she served on the board of Pioneer Appalachia Federal Credit Union. She took her role on the board very seriously. So much so she was found participating in a board meeting the day after her liver transplant surgery because she loved being a part of their vision for 22 years. We would like to thank their CEO, Dan McGowan, and his team for giving her that opportunity.

Alice loved decorating and taking care of her home. She loved fine china and was an avid collector. She also enjoyed sewing and making her grandchildren clothes, which she took such great pride in.

She loved singing in the car, eating ice cream, teapots and sleepy time tea. She especially enjoyed the beauty of fall leaves and spring flowers. Her famous lillies grew taller than her grandchildren, always leaving her family in awe of her green thumb.

While many were involved in her care, there are some important people her family would especially like to thank.

Dr. Bassam Haffar, who went above and beyond to ensure she received everything that she needed, especially in the final days leading to her transplant.

Dr. Joshua Bradford, her family doctor who is considered more like family to us. We thank you for your dedication and support.

Her family would also like to extend a heartfelt thanks to everyone at Duke University Hospital. They worked tirelessly to save her life, and when it was time to prepare us for her passing, they showed us immense love and compassion, ensuring she maintained as much dignity as possible until her very last breath.

Dr. Maria Segovia, her hepatologist who walked alongside Alice on this journey for 15 years, ensuring she remained well enough for us to cherish the time we had with her.

Dr. Stan Branch who showed incredible compassion when we made that pivotal decision to move forward to transplant. He was kind enough to call at 9pm that busy day and his kind demeanor was so reassuring.

We will especially never forget her last assigned RN, Megan Mcpherson in SICU, who made her final moments on earth peaceful and comfortable. That

day, Megan showed true compassion and gave me honest support when I needed it most.

We also deeply appreciate her ICU attending, Dr. R.J. Krom, who stood by me during the darkest moment of my life, giving me the courage to let my mother rest in peace. His kind bedside manner will always be remembered.

As a transplant patient, she couldn't have flowers. In celebration of her life, we ask that flowers surround her as she loved them so much.

Funeral Service for Alice will be 11:00 am Friday July 5, 2024 at Chapman Funeral Home Hurricane, WV. We encourage her friends and family to wear colorful attire, as this is how she loved to celebrate life. Her most favorite colors were blue and green.

Friends may visit with family Wednesday July 3, 2024 from 6:00 pm until 8:00 pm at the funeral home.

Mom, I know you're reading this, and we hope you feel as honored as we did writing your story. It was a true honor to call you our mother and to know you as a person who showed class and grace with everything you did. We love you with every ounce of our heart and soul.
