Frank and Ann only lived a half mile from us (walking the railroad tracks). My brother and I would walk to their house. They cared for us, preparing meals and I am sure buying some of our clothes. Frank drove me and my "date" to the junior high prom at Midway. He also let me wear one of his sport coats to the prom. I can remember Ann coming home from work and preparing meals for us and we would eat at the dining room table. Again, this is while my mother was working trying to provide what she could.*

I will always have memories of Frank and Ann for being great parents to me and my brother. I guess that was part of GOD's plan since they could not have children of their own.
