Byron J. "BJ" Moore, 89 of St. Albans passed away Wednesday, April 7, 2015 at Hubbard Hospice House West, South Charleston, WV.

Born November 25, 1925 in Gilmer County, he was a son of the late Jasper and Effie G. Brady Moore. He was also preceded in death by his sisters, Eula, Gladys and Melba Moore and his brothers, Rodney and Garney Moore.

BJ was a member of First Baptist Church, St. Albans and was retired in 1991 from Columbia Gas Transmission with 33 years of service. He was a graduate of Normantown High School and served his country proudly with the United States Navy stationed on the USS LST 468 in the South Pacific during World War II. He also was a member of the Westside Volunteer Fire Department for over 50 years serving as Fire Chief for five of those years.

Surviving are his wife, Betty Moore, whom he married December 2, 1951; his son, Byron J. Moore, II (Lisa) of Scott Depot; his granddaughters, Abigail and Emily Moore.
