C. Homer Womack, 97, of St. Albans went home to be with the Lord on Sunday, March 18, 2018 at the SweetBriar Assisted Living, Dunbar.

Born in St. Albans to the late Henry E. and Amanda Buzzard Womack. He was also preceded in death by his son, Barry Womack and two sisters, Rachel Williams and Hazel Reed; brother, Jennings F. Womack.

He met the Lord Jesus Christ during his teenage years at Rehoboth Baptist Church in St. Albans. He later became an active member of Highlawn Baptist Church, St. Albans where he served as a Deacon and taught an adult Sunday school class, sung in the choir. He loved music and also enjoyed singing with the Barbershop Chorus and playing the banjo at home.
