Debra M. Hurlbut, 57, of St. Albans, was called home by God Sunday, March 2, 2014 at CAMC-Memorial Division.

Born November 4, 1956 in Charleston, she was a daughter of Lucille Gunno of St. Albans and the late Arthur Lee Gunno. She was also preceded in death by her father and mother-in-law, John F. and Emmy Lou Hurlbut.

A graduate of Charleston High School, Debbie received her formal training and nursing degrees from Morris Harvey College and West Virginia University. She was board certified as a Neonatal Intensive Care Nurse, a Family Nurse Practitioner and a Neonatal Nurse Practitioner, working for over 30 years with CAMC- Women and Children's Hospital and with Pediatrix Medical Group the past 12 years. She also served on the neonatal transport team with HealthNet.

She was recognized nationally by Pediatrix Medical Group in 2011 as Advanced Practitioner of the Year of the Central Region. Debbie taught nursing at WVU-Charleston Campus and through her selfless nature, contributed to the health and wellness of others by offering herself through the Center for Organ Recovery (CORE).
