She furthered her education at the Royal School of Needlework, Cambridge University and Oxford University in England. She received many awards and recognitions to include the Distinguished West Virginian, as well as, the International Poets Society for her inspirational writings. Donna was an honorary or lifetime member of the Special Forces Assoc.; Sons of Italy (which included recognition as the Italian American Woman of the Year); Catholic War Veterans; Women's Army Corps Assoc.; Veterans of Foreign Wars Ladies Auxiliary; National Organization of Rare Disorders; American Bechet's Assoc.; Blinded Veterans Assoc.; the Rewley House, Oxford University Assoc. of NY; and the Transatlantic Council Boy Scouts of America. Her memory will forever live on through her tapestries, art, and inspirational pieces in which she dedicated to World Leaders, Presidents, and Distinguished Individuals she recognized and honored throughout her lifetime. Donna had a gift like no other-?There was no stranger she had not met.? Her most loved achievement was her children. Her late son, Jackie E.
