Edward Squirts, 87, of Charleston went home to be with the Lord on Tuesday, February 28, 2017.

Ed was preceded in death by his parents, Alex and Anna Squirts, who immigrated to this country from Russia and Poland.

Ed grew up on Summers Street in a hotel that his father owned. He graduated from Charleston High School and Morris Harvey College, where he starred as a basketball athlete. Ed was a probation officer for the State of West Virginia and an army veteran of the Korean War. He was a member of the Village Chapel Presbyterian Church.

Dad is survived by his very close friend and companion, Lou Maxson; children, Edward A. Squirts (Daisy) and Martha Smith (Keith); grandchildren, Brian Withrow (Autumn), Chastity Thornton, and Bridget Jett; great-grandchildren, Andrew and Maddux Withrow, and Reese Edmonds.

Ed loved sports, music, and cars. He played the accordion and harmonica. Played volleyball for many years at the YMCA and tennis at Kanawha City courts. He coached little league baseball, umpired baseball and refereed basketball for youth leagues. Dad was always a Mountaineer fan. He enjoyed NASCAR racing and Citizen Band Radio. His radio handle was "7-Up".

Dad enjoyed traveling. When we were young, he took us cross country to California, getting up early and driving all day on Rt. 66. He and Lou traveled to many beautiful and interesting places.

We will remember our father as a kind and gentle man, honest and true, and he will be missed so very much.

A celebration of Ed's life will be held 1:00 on Friday, March 3rd, at the Donel C. Kinnard Memorial State Veterans Cemetery with Pastor Todd Wright officiating.

I was fortunate to meet Ed again, under better circumstances, over 30 years later through my mother, Ann Ovington, and her good friend Lou Maxson. Apparently this crowd had a pretty good time playing tennis, traveling and most likely having a cocktail or two (although that is conjecture on my part.) Later, when I had moved Mom to Austin, TX to be closer to me, Ed and Lou came out to visit her and we became better acquainted. I learned that he loved to play the accordion, but that his needed repair and he couldn't find anyone in the Charleston area to do the work. I did, and it was a joy to see his face when he was able to play again. He seemed to be a very kind man who cherished his friendships and found the best in life no matter his circumstances. My Mom proceeded Ed in death. I hope they are back to playing tennis, sharing memories and perhaps having a drink or two, in heaven. Tell her a joke, Ed, she loves to laugh.
