Elizabeth F. Scholl Bird, 92, died Thurs June 26, 2014 in Athens, Georgia.

She was born May 9, 1922 in Wilbur, Logan County, WV to the late Franklin Ross and Flora Lee Scholl.

Elizabeth graduated from Sherman High School at Seth in 1939 where she was a cheerleader and editor of the Sherman Tattler. She was married to the late Clifford Waldo Bird of Griffithsville, W.Va. and they resided in St. Albans until 1963. She lived in Wilmington, N.C. for over forty years where he attended Pine Valley Methodist Church and after her husband's death in 1983 organized the church's New Beginner's group for widows and widowers. She also served as president of Wilmington Singles Club and was a member of Pine Valley Country Club.

Elizabeth was the mother of two children Charles Ray Bird (deceased) and Sandra Lee Bird of Winterville, GA, the grandmother of four grandsons and the great grandmother of three granddaughters. In addition she is survived by her sister Mary Carr and brother Franklin Scholl both of St. Albans. She is predeceased by brother Richard Lee and sisters Molly Jane and Joanna.

A memorial service will be held at 11:00am Tuesday July 1, 2014 at Cunningham Memorial Park, Lower Mausoleum Chapel St. Albans, with the Rev. Loretta Isaiah officiating.
