Gary David Dillon, 70 of St. Albans passed away August 20, 2017 at Thomas Memorial Hospital after a short illness.

He was born June 17, 1947 to the late Maybelle Jean and Denvil Dillon. He was also preceded in death by his sister,Carolynn Dillon.

David was a graduate of St. Albans High School, class of 1965 and Marshall University. He worked for Mountaineer Euclid, Fairchild Equipment, and Bird Machine Co. 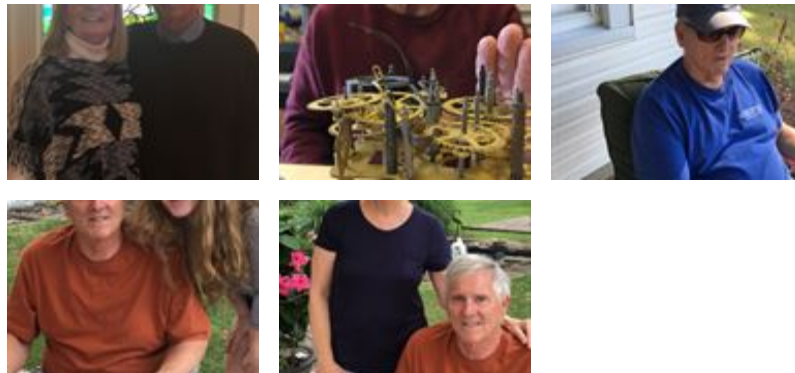
