Dr. Glenn H. Warner, 85, of St. Albans passed away Friday, September 30, 2016, at CAMC Memorial Division, Charleston.

He was born December 15, 1930, in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania to the late John D. and Marian Wolfe Warner. He was also preceded in death by a son, Dr. Hugh Warner.

Glenn was retired from Union Carbide Corp. and as an Instructor at the University of Charleston.

He was a member of the Kanawha Valley Unitarian Fellowship, Charleston. He received his BS degree from Bucknell University, MS degree from the University of Maine and his PhD from the University of New Hampshire.
