Harold Lewis Rulen 93, of Hurricane, WV peacefully passed away Saturday May 4, 2024 at Emogene Dolin Jones Hospice House Huntington, WV following a short illness.

He was born on February 22, 1931 to the late Charles and Alice Canterbury Rulen. In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by Jessie, his wife of 69 years; brothers: Charles W. "Pete" Rulen and Dale S. "Sanders" Rulen; sister: Linda Raike; and granddaughter: Heather Wood.

“ My memories and information gathered from talks with Uncle Harold. Uncle Harold loved to tell everyone how he met the love of his life. It was love at first sight.

He and Aunt Jessie were early risers. It was not uncommon for them to be up at 4 or 5 in the morning having their cup of coffee. They also ended their day early. You might find them in their lounge clothes after supper.

Uncle Harold loved garage sales and finding bicycles that he could repair. He gave away many like-new bikes. He liked getting to the sales early and even took us out the night before, when people were setting up, and asked the homeowners if we could take a peek. He loved working on old radios and loved showing people his room (man cave). He kept an antique car in his garage for many years.

He grew up ice skating during the winter months on the county ponds. He was probably the one who got me eating a tub of popcorn by myself. Love that snack. His card game was Rummy and you had to earn the title of winner.

He loved being out in the sunshine and always had a tan, never a burn. He and Aunt Jessie went on several bus trips with groups seeing many US sites. They loved going to Myrtle Beach and Florida on vacations. Uncle Harold loved to fish and spent some time at Lake Okeechobee, FL. We went for a visit and he took a boat out for fishing, and took his fishing guest around and around in circles. They finally made their way back home, but without any fish. He started life at Gallipolis Ferry, WV. Other places of residence: Henderson, Point Pleasant, and Hurricane in West Virginia; Sullivan and Graysville in Indiana

He was a hard worker and received recognition for his cost-cutting ideas at work. His many work hats included being a deckhand for the Ohio River Company, mechanic for Ford Garage, then worked in plant maintenance with the Ohio Valley Electric Corporation, General Electric, and Appalachian Power Company. He became maintenance supervisor from the birth of the John E. Amos Plant. He ended his work career at the Central Machine Shop as manager. He and Aunt Jessie were there for me in an emergency trip to the

hospital. This was probably the fastest that he ever drove in his life! Their kind hearts were always ready to help and they always looked for the best in people. He enjoyed visitors, and we always enjoyed stopping in and hearing about new adventures in his life. He would drop a dollar bill on the steps for the young children to find and finders were keepers.

He and his lovely bride were more than an aunt and uncle to our generation. We were treated as their own children with love and discipline. Uncle Harold was a true gentleman and will be missed more than words can say. We were blessed to have him in our life, and we will meet again in our heavenly home. My love to all my sisters and brothers in Christ.
