



James "Coach Al" Davidson

November 10, 1927 - October 25, 2016

Long time St. Albans resident, James Allen Davidson, better known as "Coach Al" Davidson, died on October 25, 2016 at home from complications of heart disease and cancer. He was 91 years old.

Al was a revered teacher and coach in St. Albans having accepted a job in 1948 at St. Albans High School which at the time was combined with the Junior High. When the schools separated, he remained at St. Albans Junior High. His 35 year coaching career in St. Albans included many winning teams and championships in multiple sports and in 1966 he was voted Coach of the Year in Kanawha County. And for over 25 years he officiated high school basketball and football. The St. Albans Junior High Gymnasium was named in his honor in 1983 and he was inducted into the St. Albans High School Hall of Fame in 1996.

Al Davidson was born in Northfork, West Virginia in 1924, the eldest son of Zelphia and Allen Crockett Davidson. His academic career at West Virginia Tech was interrupted by World War II and he served as a ball turret gunner on a B-17 with the Eighth Air Force based in Nutt Hampstead, England. Active in the West Virginia Eight Air Force Historical Society, he was elected president in 1996.

After the war, Coach returned to Tech and when he graduated, he had earned

11 athletic letters. He was second in the nation in punting in his senior year with a 43.3 yard average. In 1977 he was voted into the Tech Hall of Fame as an Outstanding Athlete.

After posting a 28-2 record as a pitcher for the Golden Bears, Al was offered a contract by the Brooklyn Dodgers but when he was offered fifty dollars more a month to coach, he passed up the chance at professional baseball and moved to St. Albans. He never regretted that decision and was proud of having taught and coached 22,500 students. He later earned his Master's Degree in Education at West Virginia University.

After retiring in 1983, Coach served on the St. Albans City Council for four years and spent six years as a dedicated volunteer for St. Mark's Food Pantry. Coach was a congregant at First Presbyterian Church in St. Albans for over 30 years and served as an Elder and Trustee.

His wife of thirty two years, the former Lucille Chittum predeceased him as well as his sister, Libby Lyon of San Antonio, TX. Coach is survived by his daughter, Diann Williams of St. Albans, son James and wife Debra of North Myrtle Beach, S.C., son Jerry and wife Mary of New Providence, NJ, five grandchildren, eight great- grandchildren and his sister, Janet Barbour of Huntington.

Funeral service will held 2pm Friday, October 28, 2016 at First Presbyterian Church, 201 Kanawha Terrace, St. Albans with Rev. Paul Romine officiating. Visitation will be held from 5-8pm Thursday at Bartlett-Chapman Funeral Home, St. Albans and one hour prior to the service Friday at the church. Entombment with military honors will follow in Cunningham Memorial Park, St. Albans, WV. You may visit his tribute page at ChapmanFuneralHomes.com to share memories with the family.

“ Dear Folks,

I know Al was a part of the lives of thousands of people. I am one. I just wanted to share with you a few of my memories.

I was a 12 year old seventh grader when I first met him. I lived only two blocks from old Crawford Field and he had just graduated from WV Tech and starting his first job as a teacher and assistant football coach at SAHS. By my senior year I was his student assistant in teaching phys ed classes and considering a career in journalism and coaching. I can still remember the many times we played "kickback" (a punting contest) when I was a boy. I never beat him. I saw Al infrequently over the years. I was attending physician to some members of his wife's family and we played golf a number of times in the 70's and 80's. I couldn't beat him there either.

I have played with and seen many athletes over the past decades and can honestly say that Al was one of the two best all-around athletes I have ever seen. He could do anything...in any sport..and excel. He could have been a major league pitcher, an NFL punter, and, except for his size, a pro basketball player. I still remember him being the first person I ever saw hit a baseball over the left field fence and out onto route 60 at the old SAHS field located by the St. Albans-Nitro bridge. But his family came first.

Al Davidson was the epitome of the decent, kind, and caring human being. His type is rare and you were fortunate if you got to meet and know at least one of his ilk during your life-time. To put it simply, his was a life well lived.

Even at his great age I know he will be missed. You have my deepest sympathy.
