John E. "Jack" "Pappy" Williams, 79, of Cross Lanes passed away Sunday, July 1, 2018 at Hubbard Hospice House West, South Charleston. He was a colon cancer survivor since the age of 23.

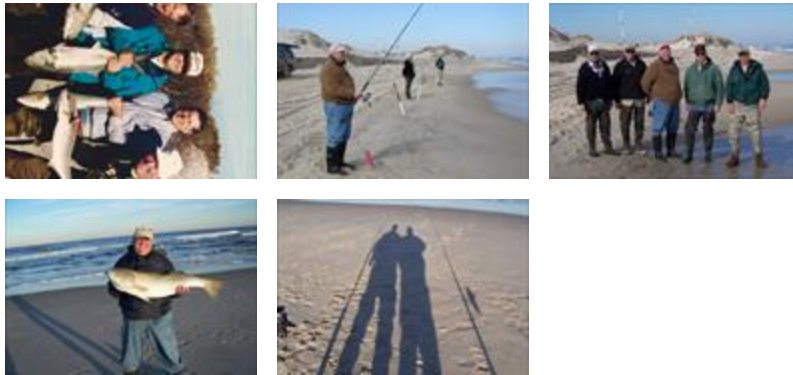
