Joseph Bryan Tribble, 90, of St. Albans went home to be with the Lord on Wednesday, March 7, 2018 at St. Mary's Medical Center, Huntington.

He was born in Charleston to the late Boyd and Ruth Marshall Tribble. He was also preceded in death by his loving wife, Rose Hackett Tribble; sisters, Neva Pyle and Louis Woodell.

Joe was a member of the First Baptist Church of St. Albans. He was an exceptional man of God and was loved by everyone who knew him. He wrote and shared Christian Poetry.
