Mansour Mashayekhi 69, of Hurricane, WV passed away on January 23, 2026 at St. Mary's Medical Center.

He was born on May 10, 1956 to the late Janette Baghery and Zine Al Abidine Mashayekhi in Mianeh, Iran. In addition to his parents, he was also preceded in death by five siblings.

Mansour was the Owner of PremierSolutions Inc., where he designed and installed industrial water treatment systems. Prior to founding his business, he had worked for Allied Signal and the WV Department of Natural Resources. He retired from the WV Public Service Commission last year.

He is survived by his wife of 42 years, Crystal Elaine Minton Mashayekhi; his daughter, Andrea and Richard Payne; and his son, Daniel Mashayekhi; one brother, two sisters, many nephews, nieces and cousins in Iran.
