



Marvin Forest Morrison

May 22, 1917 - November 14, 2013

Marvin F. Morrison, 96 of Charleston was called to the Lord on Thursday November 14, 2013.

Born May 22, 1917 in Milton, Marvin was a son of the late Alfred and Maude Morrison. In addition to his parents, he was also preceded in death by his wife, Ilda Morrison and daughter Jane Morrison.

Marvin was a graduate of Milton High School and a 1939 graduate of Marshall College. He served his country in the Army during World War II and was an active member of the Charleston Baptist Temple. Marvin retired from Appalachian Electric Power, where he worked in personnel management. Marvin also served his community on the Charleston City Council and as a member of the Lions Club for many years.

He is survived by his daughter Karen Merkel; granddaughters Kathryn Ball, her husband John, and Sara Merkel; and brother Donald Morrison.

Funeral service will be held at 11:00am Monday November 18, 2013 at Charleston Baptist Temple, 209 Morris Street, Charleston with Dr. Dennis L. Johnson officiating. A committal service will be held at 1:00pm Monday at Forest Memorial Park Mausoleum Chapel, Milton.
