Randolph Louis "Randy" Roswell, 66, of Scott Depot went home to be with the Lord Saturday, September 12, 2020.

Born September 7, 1954 in Washington, DC, he was a son of the late William and Wanda Kessell Roswell. He was also preceded in death by sister, Deborah Roswell.
