Robert “Bob” Emmett Jarrett, 91, of Scott Depot, West Virginia passed peacefully unto the Lord on May 17th, 2019 with his family by his side. He was the first-born of Robert Emmett Sr. and Lottie Jarrett on May 4th, 1928 in Charleston, West Virginia.

He is preceded in death by his beloved wife, Nellie “Charlie”, parents, Robert Sr. and Lottie, brothers, Charles and Frank, and sisters, Betty and Ruth-Ann.
