Robert Lee "Bob" Pennington, 70, of Winfield, passed away January 26, 2014 at his home.

Bob was born May 21, 1943 in Charleston, to the late William and Bernice Ranson Pennington. As a CPA he served as Vice President of Finance and treasurer at CONCORP, Inc. Bob was a member of Putnam County Chamber of Commerce, and was recently recognized as Volunteer of the Year for the Putnam County Development Authority. He was also a member of Winfield Baptist Church where he served as Treasurer for 20 years.

He wound up in Ms. Schwing's class while I went with Ms. Ryan. I don't believe we were in the same classroom together until 6th grade. We had Ms. Jones, and we used to try to get the classroom thermometer up to 90 degrees so she would take us outside under a tree and read stories to us.

When we were little Bob lived across the street. He got that first TV about a year or so before we did, so I would go to his place and we would watch soap operas and game shows in the dark because he had that Sylvania TV with the lighted ring around the edges. His Mom would make us popcorn by vigorously moving a pot back and forth across the stove. I always remember his Mom calling him Bobby Lee

We used to play pick up games of baseball and football in my yard. We also developed games of dice baseball and paper baseball with our mutual friend Gary Barkus, who is also deceased. I still remember that two was a homerun and three was a double in our dice baseball game.

When Bob moved near the high school we had less contact with each other, but we did participate in All State Chorus in high school. We had a great trip to Parkersburg which I'm sure those who were there remember.

I will always remember that Bob came to my Mother's funeral in Dunbar a number of years ago. It meant so much to me.

In recent years Bob and I have spent a good deal of time communicating via e-mail. We primarily discussed politics and religion. We were worlds apart on politics, but we did find a lot of common ground on religion.

I received my last e-mail from Bob on Thursday. We had also

recently discussed the chemical spill and water ban in West Virginia. I remember him saying how happy he was to be able to take a shower again.

I consider Bob to have been an important part of my life. I will miss the many communications we shared.
