It is with deep sadness that we announce the passing of our beloved husband, father, and grandfather, Sanford "Sam" Bryant Cunningham of Winfield, West Virginia who left us on June 14, 2024, at the age of 63. After courageously battling a chronic illness, he passed away peacefully surrounded by his family.

Sam was born to the late Sanford Otmer and Charlotte Louise Cunningham (nèe Songer), formerly of Dunbar, West Virginia.

Sam was a 1979 graduate of Dunbar High School and went on to attend Marshall University on a wrestling scholarship.
