Suzette Christine Harich, 61, of Hurricane, WV, passed away on September 10, 2016, at the Hubbard Hospice House in Charleston, WV. She was born on November 28, 1954, to the late Louis P. and Theresa Lengel Harich of St. Albans.

Suzette was educated at St. Francis of Assisi Parochial School and Charleston Catholic and St. Albans High Schools, and held degrees from WVU and Marshall in English and Reading Education. She began her career in McDowell County in 1977, and then taught in Kanawha County from 1993 until her retirement in 2014, most recently at Hayes Middle School. Although she had no children of her own, she always considered her students to be her "kids". Many of them have shared their memories of the help she gave to them.

Suzie loved nature and was an avid bird watcher. She was especially fond of rainbows. Her home on Sycamore Ridge in Putnam county was her "heaven on earth". She had many feline friends who kept her company over the years.

She is survived by brothers Philip L. (Jane Yeager) Harich and Kim C. Harich, sister Melanie Hornsby, nephews Philip L. Jr. and Christopher H. Harich, great-nephews Philip L III, Dylan and Thaddeus Harich, and great-nieces Hannah and Charlotte Harich.
