“ I have know my friend, William David “Butch” Jenkins since he was 9 years old and want to share some of his life events with you.

He was an East End boy. Lived in a house beside Laidley Field. We played touch football on Hansford Street and he broke both arms during a game. Mom would not let him play football in school because he seemed injury prone. Instead He became a drummer in the band at Roosevelt Jr. and later Charleston High School.

He always knew he wanted to be a Charleston Police Officer and he did. He was excellent and fearless in his job.

While in Coast Guard a fellow guardsmen fell off a “docked” boat at nighttime. He screamed for help and Butch without regards for his own safety jumped in and saved him. Butch never told me. I found out cause the person he saved told me.

He was a loyal friend who would give you shirt off his back. I have so many fond memories of our childhood and adulthood and will end with this.

“He said what he meant and meant what he said”

Like Frank Sinatra “Butch lived his life his way”

We talked weekly and he was ready to move to the next chapter.

I loved him and will miss him!

“ Butch and I worked the same shift for a while on CPD. I got in a situation that a man was trying to kill me and Butch was the only officer to ignore communications and back me up. He told me later if I was asking for help he knew I needed it so he responded. I would probably be dead right now if not for Butch. His life was also threatened during this call but he fought valiantly. Butch ended up at one hospital with me and the perpetrator ended up at another hospital. It was a literal fight for our lives. The perp got Butch's weapon away from him and intended to shoot him with his own weapon. God granted us the strength to resolve the matter with no loss of life. Butch had been through so much and survived. I am so sorry there was something that could take him out. He will be sincerely missed. My condolences to all the family and friends.
